AGE REQUIREMENTS

Children must turn the minimum age requirement on or before the day in which they are registered. Children who are 5 years of age or under must have a copy of their birth certificate on file. All children must be potty trained.

CHILDREN ARE GROUPED BY AGE: 3-4, 5-6, 7-8, 9-12. THE MUSEUM WILL NOT PROMISE PAIRING OF CAMPERS.

PAYMENT

A 50% deposit is required; per child, per session; to reserve a space in camp. Balance is due the week prior to camp. It is the parent's responsibility to contact Young At Art and pay the balance. Failure to pay balance on due date will result in your child losing their space. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** All deposits and payments are **NON-REFUNDABLE** including voluntary or mandatory withdrawal from camp. See transfer info below.

TRANSFER

All Transfer requests must be submitted via email two weeks prior to start date. Transfer approval requires a **\$25.00** fee per child and will be made depending on space availability. Only one transfer request per family will be accepted. Payments are not transferable to anyone outside of the immediate family. Submit transfer requests to Visitor Services office in person or by emailing artinstitute@youngatartmuseum.org.

ABSENCE / CANCELLATION / NO SHOW

Absences, withdrawals, no-shows or dismissals will not be eligible for refunds, transfers or make-ups.

CAMP DROP OFF/PICK UP POLICY

For the first day and every day of camp thereafter for each session, campers must be escorted into the building by a parent/guardian for check-in. Children registered for before care may be dropped off 8:00am to 8:45am. All others may be dropped off 8:45am to 9:15am.

EARLY DROP-OFF/LATE PICK-UP (Must be escorted into building for check-in)

Students dropped off before 8:45am and picked up after 5:00pm will be automatically charged for extended care at a rate of \$15.00 per day. Extended care students picked up after 6:00pm will be automatically charged \$5.00 plus \$1.00 per minute.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Welcome to CampYAA! Your kids will have fun in an artistic and safe camp environment. The following will hopefully answer most of your questions. Please review the information below, since our policies & procedures change periodically.

Q. What are my options for CampYAA this year?

This year Young At Art is offering 7 different options for Summer Camp. The option you choose for your child will depend largely on your child's age and interests.

Art Exploration Camp

Ages: (Ages 3-4*, 5-6, 7-8, 9-12)

*Preschool only available sessions 1-9

Times: 9:00am-5:00pm

1 week sessions: \$255 per week for Members, \$285 per week for Non-Members

Campers will make a minimum of 3 art projects based on a weekly theme inspired by art techniques, artists, time periods, and art media. Most weeks will include a clay project while other projects will include any of the following: painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture, sewing and mixed media. They will also enjoy exploring the museum, library and Shop YAA. Campers will also participate in the special guest artist series "Through the Artist Lens" where they will meet visiting artists. The focus of this camp will be art experiences and exhibit exploration. These camps will take place in the exhibit workshop rooms and the YAA Museum Preschool for campers ages 3-4.

YAA Digital Arts Camp

Ages 8-14

Times: 9:00am-5:00pm

Two, 2 week sessions: \$525 per session for Members, \$575 per session for Non-Members

Session 1: June 10-21: *Drawing to Digital*

Session 2: June 24- July 5*: *Animation Jam!* *No Camp July 4th

Campers will experience a fun and immersive digital arts workshop using the iPad (iPads provided). Campers will explore the art of digital drawing, painting, cartooning, animation, and special effects in our digital art studio. The two sessions are structured where campers can take all, two week long sessions and build on their skills, or take

each two week long session independently. Each camper will take home a jump drive wristband of their work. At the end of each session there will be an open house of student work for friends and family to attend.

Ceramics & Sculpture Camp

Ages: 8-14

Times: 9:00am-5:00pm

Two, 2 week sessions: \$525 per session for Members, \$575 per session for Non-Members

Session 1: June 10-21 *On the Table*

Session 2: June 24- July 5* *Clay the Japanese Way* *No Camp July 4th

Campers will experience a fun and immersive camp curriculum. During their two week session, campers will work with practicing artists. These sessions are structured where campers can take both two week sessions and experience different projects. Camp will take place in the Ceramics and Sculpture Studio. At the end of each session there will be an open house to showcase student work, family and friends are invited.

Drawing Camp

Ages: 8-14

Times: 9:00am-5:00pm

One, 1 week session: July 8-12: \$260 per session for Members, \$285 per session for Non-Members

Campers will experience a more challenging art curriculum. During their one week session, campers will work with practicing artists. They will learn figure drawing, perspective, shading and work with a variety of dry media. At the this session there will be an open house of student work for friends and family to attend.

Painting Camp

Ages: 8-14

Times: 9:00am-5:00pm

One, 1 week session: July 15-19: \$260 per session for Members, \$285 per session for Non-Members

Campers will experience a more challenging art curriculum. During their two week session, campers will work with practicing artists. They will learn a variety of techniques utilizing acrylic, oil and watercolor paints. At the this session there will be an open house of student work for friends and family to attend.

Cosplay Fashion Camp

Ages 10-14

Times: 9:00am-5:00pm

One, 2 week sessions: July 22- August 2: \$525 per session for Members, \$575 per session for Non-Members

Campers will learn the basics of hand-sewing and then graduate to sewing on the sewing machine (sewing machines provided). They will design and create wearable fashions and accessories. At the this session there will be a fashion show of student work for friends and family to attend.

Camp Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Some of the specialty camps: Ceramics & Sculpture, Digital Art & Film, Video Gaming, and Fashion camps are 2 week sessions, do campers have to attend the full 2 weeks?

- The projects are geared to carry over for the whole 2 week period. The project outcomes are also based on students attending the entire time. It is not recommended that campers start or leave mid-session. If you are not able to make a 2 week commitment, then perhaps you may be interested in enrolling for Art Exploration Camp, Drawing, Painting, or Video Gaming (one week) with one week sessions.

Q. Who are the camp staff?

- The YAA Institute Camp team are trained art educators in a variety of artistic media; are First Aid & CPR Certified, Fingerprinted and Background checked, Trained by NSU UM Center for Autism and Related Disabilities (CARD) and educators.

**Teachers may change due to scheduling and camp needs and all teachers do not teach the entire summer.*

Q. Where will the Summer Camp be in the museum?

- The campers will be able to experience and explore the entire museum with their assigned group.
- Art Exploration Camp will be held in the exhibit classrooms and YAA Museum.
- Preschool ages 3-4 will be in our licensed Preschool classroom in WonderScapes, with visits to the YAA Institute Studios and exhibit galleries.
- Ceramics & Sculpture camp will be held in the Ceramics Studio with visits to the exhibit galleries.
- Drawing camp will be held in the Painting and Printmaking Studio with visits to the exhibit galleries.
- Painting camp will be held in the Painting and Printmaking Studio with visits to the exhibit galleries.
- Digital Arts camp will take place in the Digital Studio with visits to the YAA Institute Studios and exhibit galleries.
- Video Game Design Camp will be held in the Digital Studio with visits to the YAA Institute Studios and exhibit galleries.
- Fashion Camp will be held in the Painting Studio with visits to the YAA Institute Studios and exhibit galleries.

Q. What are the age limits for camp?

- Campers 3-4, 5-6, 7-8, 9-12 may attend Art Exploration Camp. Campers must have turned 3 years of age on or prior to their first day of camp, and be fully potty trained. Pre-school (ages 3-4) camp is available beginning on Wednesday, June 5- Friday, August 2nd and for sessions 1-8.
- Campers 8-14 may attend specialty camps including Ceramics & Sculpture Camp, Drawing, Painting Camp, and Digital Arts.
- Campers 9-14 may attend all specialty camps noted above as well as Video Game Design Camp.
- Campers 10- may attend all specialty camps noted above as well as Fashion Camp.

Q. My Children are 5 years old and 9 years old. Can they be together?

- Campers are grouped by age. The Museum will not promise the pairing of campers. If parents would like children together who are outside of the established age groups, the older child will have to go to the younger age group.

The age groups are normally what you see below but are subject to change:

- Ages 3-4 Pre-K
- Ages 5-6 Group 1
- Ages 7-8 Group 2
- Ages 9-12 Group 3
- Ages 8-14 Ceramic & Sculpture, Drawing, Painting, Digital Arts
- Ages 9-14 Video Game Design Camp
- Ages 10-14 Fashion Camp

Q. Does the museum offer a discount for multiple campers?

- The museum offers a 10% sibling discount that cannot be combined with other discounts.

Q. Are campers required to wear YAA T-Shirts? Where can I purchase a YAA T-Shirt?

- YAA T-shirts are a fun way to show camp spirit.
- YAA T-shirts are on sale at the Shop YAA Museum Store for \$12.00 plus tax.

Q. What are the drop off and pickup procedures?

- Each day, students must be escorted into the building by a parent/guardian for check-in.
- Sign-In begins at **8:00am** for Extended Care, and **8:45am** for other campers.
- Extended Care (early) begins at **8:00am** and costs **\$70 per week**. If you are planning on registering your child for extended care, you must do so BEFORE his or her first day of camp.
- Campers dropped off before 8:45am, not enrolled in extended care will be automatically enrolled at rate of \$15.00 per day.
- Camp begins at 9:00am. Campers arriving after this time may miss instruction.
- Parents, emergency contacts and authorized pick-ups listed on your registration will be allowed to pick up your child. If you'd like to add any other names, please call and provide your security code to add names.
- Regular pick up is at 5:00pm, or 6:00pm for campers enrolled in Extended Care. Parents are welcome to pick up before 5:00pm. The earliest recommend pick up time is 3:00pm, but keep in mind that campers picked up before 3:00pm may miss instruction. Those authorized to pick up must park in a designated parking spot and walk in for pick up.
- Please remove wristbands and name tags when you sign out your child.
- Parents or visitors may visit campers in the museum exhibits or classrooms only if they are authorized at the front as a person who is on the pick-up list. Campers **MUST** be signed out at the Front Desk or Sign In/Out Table
- Campers enrolled in extended care who are picked after **6:00pm** will be automatically charged a late fee of \$5.00 plus \$1.00 per minute after.

Q. What is the security code?

- The security code is a word, short phrase, or combination of numbers you provide on your registration form. Make sure it is something you can remember. If you would like to add anyone to your authorized pick-up list we will ask you your security code to verify your identity. Please do not share this code with others.

Q. Do you offer before/after care?

- Extended Care (early) is from 8:00am-9:00am.
- Extended Care (after) is from 5:00pm-6:00pm.
- The cost is \$70.00 per week for both before and aftercare. Extended care is a package for the week and is not sold separately.

- Campers dropped off before 8:45am will automatically be enrolled and charged for extended care at a rate of \$15.00 per day.
- After 5:00pm campers not enrolled in aftercare will automatically be enrolled and charged for extended care at a rate of \$15.00 per day.
- Campers enrolled in extended care who are picked after **6:00pm** will be automatically charged a late fee of \$5.00 plus \$1.00 per minute.
- These late fees will be added to your bill and will require payment immediately.

Q. What type of clothes should my child wear?

- Clothes that you consider play clothes that can get messy.
- We provide smocks for art activities but acrylic paint and other art materials still get on clothes and may stain.
- Short sleeve t-shirts are preferred (long sleeves get wet or drag through art projects).
- Girls should not wear skirts, as campers sit on the floor and play in the exhibits.
- We recommend sneakers or closed-toe shoes. NO flip flops or wheelies are permitted.
- Campers are encouraged to wear YAA T-shirts that are available in the gift shop. Fridays are YAA T-shirt days.
- For kids who frequently need a change of clothes, we suggest packing extra clothes, in a labeled Ziploc bag with your child's name, in your camper's backpack. Please clearly mark your child's backpack and lunchbox as well. All campers must be potty trained.

Q. What if my child needs to take medicine during the camp day?

- Pack the medicine in a Ziploc bag with dosage cup or spoon.
- Clearly label medication with your child's name, dosage and time.
- Fill out Medication Form when you check your child into camp.
- All medications for campers will be stored in the Education Office except for EpiPens which go directly to the teacher.
- Your child will be escorted to the Education Office to take his/her medication.

Q. How can I reach camp staff during the day?

- To reach the camp manager, call 954-328-3877
- To reach camp staff, you may call Visitor Services (954) 424-5031. The receptionist at these numbers will contact the appropriate museum staff member.
- If you would like to speak to your child's teacher before camp, please let the sign-in staff know and they will call the teacher to the front desk.

Q. What about lunches and snacks?

- Campers eat morning snack between 10a-10:30a and lunch around 12pm, and afternoon snack is taken between 3pm- 3:45pm.
- Lunch is available for purchase WEEKLY for \$40, \$8 on Pizza Fridays only. Lunch includes an entrée, two snacks, and beverages.
- Mondays and Fridays lunch is provided by Pizza Machine and Tuesday-Thursday from SuperDuper Grub, the museum café.
- Campers with food allergies or needing a specific diet should bring a lunch, a drink & two healthy snacks in a labeled lunch bag or box. Please remind camp staff at check-in to give your child a green wristband with the child's allergy. Sibling lunches should be separated, since groups may not eat together.
- Do not pack anything that needs to be refrigerated or heated.
- Campers will **not** be able to use vending machines during camp. Vending machine purchases must be made with parents before or after camp.
- There are times when food items are used in camp projects. If your child has a food allergy, please see weekly camp schedule to determine if food items will be used. Please let your child's teacher know if your child is allergic to food items being used that week.

Q. What should my child bring to camp?

- For kids who frequently need a change of clothes, we suggest packing extra clothes in a Ziploc bag labeled with your child's name, in your camper's backpack. All campers must be potty trained.
- If your child is 3-4 years old please bring a blanket and pillow with their names on the tag for relaxation time.
- Wednesday is Movie Day. Students should bring a pillow or blanket in a labeled bag. Movies are rated, G, PG or PG 13. If you prefer your child does not watch the movie please notify your child's teacher in person. If this is the case, your child will join another group.
- Fridays are outdoor play and water day, weather permitting. Campers will need to pack a towel, swimsuit, sunblock, and change of clothes in a labeled bag with their names. Water play involves lawn water toys and equipment.
- Label all backpacks and personal items with your child's name, ie lunch bags, sweaters/jackets tags, and Ziploc bags with clothing.

Q. What shouldn't my child bring to camp?

Children will be engaged throughout the day and socialization is highly encouraged. Personal items brought by campers often cause unnecessary distraction and conflict with others. This can be avoided if the following items are left at home.

- **NO Cell Phones** – If you require your child to keep a cell phone then it is imperative that students ask their teacher's permission prior to calling home or texting parents.
- **NO Toys and Electronic items** (videogames, tablets, electronic sketch pads, iPads, cell phones) – We will have lots of fun and educational activities to keep kids busy. When kids bring their own toys to camp, they may get damaged, lost, or cause distraction or conflict.
- **NO Money**; unless it is a designated Shop YAA Gift Shop Day. We discourage campers from bringing money. The weekly schedule will note shopping days. Money will need to be labeled in a sealed envelope or Ziploc bag with your child's name, teacher name and total amount enclosed, and given to a staff member during check-in, in the morning.
- Young At Art Museum will not be responsible for lost or damaged personal items, including toys, electronic devices, clothing, etc.
- **If personal items are found in your child's possession, the teacher will ask for your child to leave the items in his/her backpack or the items may need to be stored in the Education office until the end of the day.** If the items are continually causing problems then the teacher may confiscate the item and give it to the parent at the end of the day.

Q. What is Shop YAA Gift Shop day?

- Campers will explore the Gift Shop on Fridays, schedule subject to change.
- ShopYAA Museum store days give our campers a chance to visit and purchase items in the Museum Gift Shop during their camp day. Check the weekly camp schedule for designated ShopYAA Museum store days.
- Money for ShopYAA will need to be labeled in a sealed envelope or Ziploc bag with your child's name, teacher name and total amount enclosed, and given to a staff member during check-in, in the morning.

Q. What is Library Exploration Day?

- Campers will explore the library on Thursdays, subject to change.
- Campers will be allowed to put their books on hold at the reservation desk. Parents can check out their child's books at pick up in the afternoon.
- Campers can participate in the summer reading program if they know their email address.

Q. Will Campers go outside?

- There will be a time when campers participate in outdoor art or play. Campers will be allowed to play in the art courtyards, and grassy areas of the YAA campus.

Q. What if I forget artwork, lunch box or other belongings at YAA on Friday?

- All artwork, lunch boxes and other belongings are kept at the museum for 1 week after the last day of each session. Artwork and belongings must be picked up within the week. Unfortunately, items left after a week will be disposed of due to space.

Q. What other activities are offered as part of the Camp day?

- Campers will also participate in “Daily Highlights.” These are additional activities planned within the camp day. Daily Activities are as follows:
 - Monday: Museum Exploration
 - Tuesday: Special Guest Artists Series
 - Wednesday: Character Dress Up Day
 - Thursday: Library Exploration
 - Friday: Movie Day & Shop YAA Museum Gift Shop Day

Q. What are the camp rules?

At the beginning of each week campers will come up with a group name and a set of classroom rules, these rules will include:

- Listen to teachers and follow directions
- Keep hands, feet, and objects to self at all times
- Use polite and helpful language at all times
- Treat teachers, classmates, and the space, work, and property of classmates with respect
- Use inside voices and walking feet in the museum
- Handle supplies, equipment, and each other with care
- Stay with teachers, staff, and Museum group.

Q. What is the Behavior Policy?

Campers who are not following the camp rules (stated above) will have the following consequences:

1st offense – Verbal warning

2nd offense – Consequences for their actions (possibly missing out on activities) and parent notification

3rd offense – Parent notification via phone, written notice or in person by the Art Institute Manager or teacher

4th offense – Parent meeting with Art Institute Manager

5th offense – Possible suspension or expulsion from Young At Art’s Summer Program

Any action committed by a child that could or does result in injury to themselves, other campers, volunteers or staff will result in immediate expulsion from Young At Art’s Summer Program. No refunds are given if child is dismissed due to behavior issues!

ANTI-BULLYING POLICY

Young At Art Museum has a zero tolerance policy for bullying. Young At Art is committed to protecting its campers, staff, and volunteers from bullying, harassment, or discrimination for any reason and of any type. Young At Art believes that all campers, staff and volunteers, are entitled to a safe, equitable, and harassment-free camp experience. Bullying, harassment, or discrimination will not be tolerated and shall be just cause for disciplinary action. Bullying is defined as: “Bullying” means systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students, employees, or volunteers. It is further defined as: unwanted purposeful written, verbal, nonverbal, or physical behavior, including but not limited to any threatening, insulting, cyber-bullying or dehumanizing gesture, that has the potential to create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment or cause long term damage; cause discomfort or humiliation; or unreasonably interfere with the individual’s performance or participation, is carried out repeatedly and is often characterized by an imbalance of power. Bullying may involve, but is not limited to: unwanted teasing, threatening, intimidating, stalking, cyberstalking, cyberbullying, physical violence, theft, sexual, religious, or racial harassment, public humiliation, destruction of museum or personal property, social exclusion, including incitement and/or coercion, rumor or spreading of falsehoods.

Q. Do YAA Campers take fieldtrips?

- YAA camp brings in Special Guest Artists on Tuesdays in lieu of leaving the museum for fieldtrips.

Q. Does YAA Camp offer make-up classes, or refunds?

- There are no refunds, transfers or make-ups for absence, withdrawals, no-shows, or dismissals.

Q. Can I transfer from one week to another?

- All Transfer requests must be submitted in writing two weeks prior to start date. Transfer approval requires a \$25.00 fee per child and will be made depending on space availability. Only one transfer request per family will be accepted. Payments are not transferable to anyone outside of the immediate family. Submit transfer requests to Visitor Services office in person or by emailing ArtInstitute@youngartmuseum.org.

Q. Where is the preschool located?

- The YAA Preschool is located in our WonderScapes Early Childhood Gallery. The door has a key code lock so the general public is unable to enter.

Q: Is there a nap time?

- There is a relaxation time for one hour in the day in the preschool camp group. Children who are tired may rest, those who aren't read quietly with a book on their matts.
