Teaching artists will have practical experience in a variety of fields including drawing, painting, digital art, animation, cartooning, video game design, digital photography, ceramics, sculpture, printmaking and mixed media. Teaching artists will conduct classes in the days, afternoons, evenings, and weekends to varying ages from age 5 to adults. Teaching artists will be practicing artists with the ability to teach their media to our students and the public.

Write, implement and execute an extremely creative and cutting edge, fine art curriculum for art classes, camps, workshops, afterschool programs, and special events to varying ages, abilities, socioeconomic, cultural, at-risk populations

Communicate the YAA philosophy and integrate importance of process and product Create teaching samples and research current artists, artistic styles, movements, and teaching methods

Have great customer service skills to interact with students, parents, staff, volunteers, partners and donors in a positive and manner

Implement positive social emotional practices and create a welcoming and inclusive classroom Maintain inventory, organization, and cleanliness of art studios
